Chimpanze	<i>Pan troglodytes</i>	Seen 19 and 21/2 and heard 20/2 in Budongo Forest, and heard in Bwindi N.P. 2-4/3,
Mountain Gorilla	<i>Gorilla beringei</i>	The group participated in a tracking in Bwindi Impenetrable Forest N.P. 1/3. After about four hours of tracking the group of animals, Mubare was located. The group consisted of 13 animals including one magnificent silverback, Ruhondeza (which means oversleeping) about 30 years old. The total population of Gorillas in Uganda consists of 349 in Bwindi and 11 in Mgahinga.

Red-tailed Monkey	<i>Cercopithecus (cebus) ascanius</i>	Budongo 19-20/2, Bwindi Impenetrable Forest N.P:27/2, 28/2, 1/3

Straw-coloured Fruit-bat	<i>Eidolon helvum</i>	Kampala 8-9/3. About an hour after sunset 22/2 a large flock of Fruit Bats left the caves at Kabalega Falls. This flock is said to contain three species of Frut Bats of different size: This, the following and one not known to us.

Side-striped Jackal	<i>Canis adustus</i>	Mburu 5/3 A grey Canis with white tip of tail was seen briefly. The <i>C. adustus</i> is the only species of generae <i>Canis</i> and <i>Vulpes</i> present in the area. <i>C. adustus</i> is a regular vistitor to the park.

Western Tree Hyrax	<i>Dendrohyrax dorsalis</i>	Budongo 18-20/2 heard every night. <i>D. dorsalis</i> is the only <i>Dendrohyrax</i> to this part of Uganda.
African Bush Elephant	<i>Loxodonta a. africana</i>	Kabalega Falls N.P. 23/2 one single male on his own, and a family of about 15 animals including at least three babies. Queen Elisabeth N.P. 26/2

African (Savanna-) Buffalo	<i>Syncerus caffer caffer</i>	Kabalega Falls N.P. 22-24/2, Queen Elisabeth N.P. 25-26/2
