

San Miguelito Jaguar Reserve Bolivia Mammal Expedition.

Date: August 14-20th 2015

23 Mammals recorded include:

Night Monkeys, Black Howler Monkeys, Dusky Marmosets, Brown Capuchin Monkeys, 3 Toed Sloth , 2 Geoffreys Cats, Tayra, Coatis, Grey Brocket Deer, Capybara, Collared and White Lipped Peccaries, Titi Monkeys, 3 Banded Armadillo , 6 Banded Armadillo , Crab Eating Fox, Crab Eating Raccoon, 2 Tapir , 2 Neotropical Otters, Central American Agouti, Brazilian Porcupine, Forest Rabbit and 1 Tamandua

Birds we recorded over 68 species and many different reptiles including Coral Snakes, Ferderlance Vipers, Spectacled Caiman, Neotropical Rattlesnake and Red Tailed Boa.

List does not include multiple bat species we encountered.

On our camera traps we recorded everything from Margay , Jaguarundi, Jaguar, Puma, Giant Anteater, Tapir, Ocelots and more.



While we did not see the Jaguar or Puma we noted a lot of different tracks, scat and images on the camera traps to prove there are in the region in high density.



Species to note include:

3 Geoffreys Cats which we observed in one night of driving around the Soya fields surrounding the property

Neotropical Otters by the road in a swampy area surrounding Soya fields

3 banded Armadillos numerous sightings while trekking

Tamandua crossed the road while we were doing a night drive

Brazilian Porcupine eating fruit from a Motacu Palm / first one ever recorded on the property

3 toed Sloth spotted during a canoe trip, this was also a first for the area

Tayra spotted during a morning walk along one of the cattle trails.

Night Monkeys on 2 occasions one group was in the evening and the 2nd group

surrounded our animal hide 2 Lowland Tapirs on the road during an early morning drive through the property

Sadly a monster Jaguar was shot and killed in the area. This Jaguar was one of the largest ever recorded.
