Southern River Otter	<i>Lutra longicaudis</i>	One Transpanteneira on route from JER to Pixaim One Serra das Araras
Giant River Otter	<i>Pteronura brasiliensis</i>	Groups of 8 and 4-5, plus a single at Pixaim Four along the Rio Cuiaba
Ocelot	<i>Felis pardalis</i>	Three singles seen along the Transpanteneira between JER and Porto Joffre, two at close range, one videoed.
Jaguar	<i>Panthera onca</i>	A male distantly on the Transpanteneira N of Porto Joffre just before dusk A female spotlighted at c.100 yards range along the Transpanteneira 5 km N of the previous sighting. A female seen well (& videoed) in broad daylight along a tributary off of the Rio Cuiaba. Initially flushed but sitting in the same spot when we returned 30 minutes later.
Collared Peccary	<i>Tayassu tajacu</i>	Two seen briefly near JER
Red Brocket Deer	<i>Maxama americana</i>	A total of seven, 3 singles & 2 twos, over 4 days along the Transpanteneira, one videoed at close range
Pampas Deer	<i>Ozotoceros bezoarticus</i>	Two Sierra de Canastra NP
Marsh Deer	<i>Blastocerus dichotomus</i>	A total of seven seen along the Transpanteneira
Capibara	<i>Hydrochaeris hydrochaeris</i>	Seen daily in the Pantanal, especially common at the southern end of the Transpanteneira, c.200
Azara's Agouti	<i>Agouti azarae</i>	One at the N end of the Transpanteneira, an unidentified agouti on route from Pixaim to JER
Brazilian Rabbit	<i>Sylliviliagus brasiliensis</i>	Two at N end of Transpanteneira. One dead on road near Itatiaia
