

Assam Plains and Primates 2013 Trip Report

Dates: 9th February - 17th February 2013

Sites covered: Kaziranga National Park and Gibbon Wildlife Sanctuary

Leader: Aniket Sardana

A total of 4 nights were spent in Kaziranga (KNP) with 1 night at Gibbon (GWLS), comprising 6 game drives and 5 nature walks respectively. In Kaziranga the zone break down was 4 drives in the central range, 1 in eastern and 1 in the western range. At Gibbon, 4 day-hikes were made and 1 brief night walk. The temperature during the day ranged from the mid to high 20s (degrees celcius) dropping into the teens in the early and late hours.

Sightings

MAMMALS

Bengal Tiger (Panthera tigris tigris)

Two different individuals were seen. The first was stalking through the grass in the central range on day 1. The second was seen from Donga lake watch tower as it came to drink at the waters edge.

Asian Elephant (Elephas maximus)

Heard only at Gibbon WLS but common in Kaziranga.

Great One-horned Rhinoceros (Rhinoceros unicornis)

Common in Kaziranga.

Asiatic water Buffalo (Bubalus arnee)

Common in Kaziranga

Western Hoolock Gibbon (Hoolock hoolock)

Seen several times in Gibbon WLS.

Capped langur (Semnopithecus dussumieri)

Common in Gibbon WLS and seen briefly en route to eastern range of Kaziranga.

Pig-tailed macaque

Seen well in Gibbon WLS.

Rhesus macaque (Macaca mulatta mulatta)

Seen in roadside settlement and common in Kaziranga.

Soft-ground swamp deer (Rucervus duvaucelii ranjitsinghi)

Common in Kaziranga, which is one of its two remaining strongholds.

Hog deer (Axis porcinus)

Very common in Kaziranga

Barking deer (Muntiacus muntjak aureus)

Seen briefly in Kaziranga.

Sambar (Rusa unicolor)

Seen once from watch tower in Kaziranga's central range.

Wild boar (Sus scrofa cristatus)

Common in Kaziranga.

Asian short-clawed otter

Seen once in central range and once from Donga lake watch tower.

Hoary-bellied squirrel (Callosciurus pygerythrus)

Common in both parks.

Malay Giant squirrel (Ratufa bicolor)

Very common in Gibbon WLS.
